Dear Colleagues and Friends:

North Carolina has endured a lion's start to this school year. During the past week Hurricane Florence has brought damaging winds and historic amounts of rain to our state. We have seen flooding impact so much property this week and we have watched in anguish and sadness as our families, friends, and colleagues have suffered devastating losses—many for the second time in two years.

For those of us who were not impacted significantly by this storm, life is returning to somewhat of a normal routine after most of the state was on high alert during the weekend, but for those in Eastern North Carolina this week is quite a different story. We can only imagine what our friends are enduring. The lives of so many music students and teachers have been changed dramatically in less than one week.

Today, we uplift our colleagues all across the state, but particularly in Eastern North Carolina, who have been impacted by this storm. We want each of you to know that our thoughts are with you all. Music teachers are some of the most networked and family-like people in the entire education profession. With this strong network, we will all work together to move forward through this challenge.

While it is too soon to know the true needs that are to come for all of our music family following this crisis, we know there is an immediate need to try to do what is best for our students and teachers with regard to two upcoming NCMEA student events impacting middle and high school choral students. Responding to the ongoing effects of this natural disaster and wanting to meet the needs of the students and teachers in the impacted area, we have altered the NCMEA middle and high school honors choir auditions. We have worked with some of our regional school leaders and teachers to provide a flexible opportunity for these impacted students to audition for these upcoming ensembles.

#### **ADDITIONAL HONORS AUDITION DATE IN THE EAST REGION OF NC**

In an effort to provide a consistent audition process for this year's middle and high school honor choirs across the state and to provide flexibility and equity for those impacted by Hurricane Florence **we are offering an additional audition date on Saturday, October 6 from 10:00am - 2:00pm** for those students in Disaster Declared Counties/Areas as declared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 9/14/18. These counties are: Beaufort, Bladen, Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Duplin, Harnett, Jones, Lenoir, New Hanover, Onslow, Pamlico, Pender, Robeson, Sampson, and Wayne. As of this writing, we are still working on confirming a location for October 6th. The location will be confirmed once we know more about what will help these students and teachers best.

We are very grateful to choral director, Susan Morrow, and members of her church to accommodate us with the last minute venue change.

**High School Honors Choir Auditions** will be held as planned on **Saturday, September 29** at **Meredith College** in Raleigh for those students that can attend. High School students in hurricane impacted areas that are unable to safely attend the audition on Saturday, September 29th may attend the audition on October 6th. **Please refer to the modified audition policies on the following page**.

In response to this natural disaster, NCMEA urges all auditioning students, teachers and parents to be safe when traveling to the audition locations. We will work with teachers and students to ensure the opportunity to audition for these ensembles, but the safety of everyone involved is paramount. As the effects of Hurricane Florence continue to send ripples throughout our state, we will keep you updated on any pertinent information.

Parents may accompany their child in place of their normally required teacher. Depending on the judges availability for the newly scheduled date, the students will sing live for a judge or the students will be videoed on site and the judge for that voice part will score the student from the video. Students auditioning on Oct. 6 will need to pay the \$15 audition fee <u>in cash</u>. Personal checks will not be accepted.</p> <p>All the other counties in the eastern region will still audition on Wednesday, September 26 at Memorial Baptist Church in Buies Creek.
